#### Other Comments or Relevant Matters:

This Proposal will consider varying certain maximum residue limits (MRLs) in the *Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code* (the Code). This is a routine process, both to allow the sale of food with legitimate residues and to remove limits that are no longer required.

In February 2012, FSANZ agreed to consider and consult on Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) chemical review-related MRL variations in the Code rather than the APVMA performing this role.

This Proposal includes consideration of fenthion MRL variations requested by the APVMA. These relate to regulatory decisions made by the APVMA on the use of chemical products containing fenthion as part of its review of this active.

This Proposal may include consideration of other MRL variations requested by the APVMA, as well as other interested parties.
